 - i. Offered as concurrent enrollment with Hawkeye credit
 - ii. Offered term 2 or 3 in schedules
 - iii. In place of one section of Fashion and Fabrics I
 - b. SIAC agreed to move forward with this proposal

 - a. The Board approved Plant and Animal Science being offered for science credit
 - b. The Board approved offering an Extended Learning Program (ELP) course for credit
- 5. Work on action plan for SIAC goals

 - c. Suggested ways to evaluate progress were added to the plan
