- 1. Introduction of SIAC members and the role of SIAC
 - a. Mr. Howard had members introduce themselves and tell their role
 - b. Mr. Howard went over district vision and mission and the purpose of SIAC
 - i. Make recommendations to the Board about
 - Major educational needs
 - Student learning goals
 - Bullying and harassment prevention goals
- 2. Shared Bullying and Harassment Prevention Goals
 - a. Ms. Meyer went over the goals for East Elementary
 - i. Reduce staff to staff perceived bullying to 0
 - ii. Maintain 0 founded cases of bullying
 - b. Mrs. Reed went over the goals for West Elementary
 - i. Increase the number of staff members who indicate they feel safe at school from 94.74% to 100%
 - ii. Increase the percent of students who report never being bullied from 51.87% to 60%

- iii. Increase the percent of students who feel safe at school from 91.18% to 95%
- c. Mr. Howard and Mr. Hupke went over the goals for the Junior/Senior High
 - i. Continue have 100% of junior high staff members indicate they feel safe at school
 - ii. Increase the percent of junior high students who indicate they feel safe at school from 86.9% to 90%
 - iii. Continue to have 100% of senior high staff members indicate they feel safe at school
 - iv. Increase the percentage of senior high students who indicate they feel safe at school from 86.5% to 92%
 - Mrs. Reed asked about why students don't feel safe. Is it building, teachers, students, parents, etc. Mr. Howard addressed how they dig deeper into the question with specific students.
 - Mr. Post recommended a system for students to report bullying and harassment. Administration will look into this further.

3. District Technology Plan

- a. Mr. Noyes, Director of Technology, went over our technology plan goals
 - i. Use a wide variety of technology for communication and collaboration
 - ii. Use appropriate technology to demonstrate knowledge in authentic learning opportunities
 - iii. Use appropriate technology to analyze information and think critically
 - iv. Evaluate and provide input regarding current needs and access to appropriate technology
- b. Mr. Noyes will share the plan with SIAC members once the Technology Committee has finalized their work on this plan
- 4. District library/media services overview
 - a. Mrs. Lake presented the library/media services report for East, West, and the Jr./Sr. High
- b. SIAC will serve as the advisory board for the school district's library plan 5. New class proposals
 - a. Mr. Hayden presented on Plant Science and Animal Science
 - i. These are not new courses but will be able to be used for science credit
 - SIAC agreed to move forward with this proposal
 - b. Mrs. Rawlins presented an ELP course for possible elective credit
 - i. Student currently take ELP but not for credit
 - ii. Students would apply to take this course and then have to complete a service learning, research, or independent study option
 - SIAC agreed to move forward with this proposal

 - a. Mrs. Burmeister reviewed previous work on SIAC goals
 - b. Mrs. Burmeister asked the group to please take a look at the action plan and determine if the roles make sense and start thinking about how to measure the goals
