 - 8 measures used to "grade" each school building
 - 1. Proficiency
 - 2. Closing the Achievement Gap
 - 3. College and Career Readiness
 - 4. Annual Expected Growth
 - 5. Graduation Rate
 - 6. Attendance
 - 7. Staff Retention
 - 8. College and Career Ready Growth
 - Jr/Sr High is ranked acceptable
 - West Elementary is commendable
 - East Elementary was unable to rate due to the fact that they don't take the Iowa Assessments at this level
- b. There was discussion based on how the formula for ranking was determined and what this means for the school.

- 3. Postsecondary Readiness Report
 - a. Mrs. Burmeister presented on this report
 - Provides information about what graduates are doing after high school
 - 1. On average 66% of students from the graduating classes of 2012, 2013, and 2014 enrolled in a college or university within one year of high school

- 2. On average 19% of students from the graduating classes of 2012, 2013, and 2014 had to take at least one remedial course in math or English within one year of high school graduation
